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SPEAKER BIOGRAPHIES

Alison Zajdel

Alison Zajdel is the Executive Director at Cope Environmental Center and oversees operations and fund development. She has been a staff member since 2001 mostly recently serving as Development Director. Before coming to CEC she attended DePauw University majoring in Studio Arts. Aubrey Blue is the Program Director at Cope Environmental Center. Aubrey has a Bachelor's degree from Indiana University East and oversees all programming at CEC. Aubrey became a Certified Interpretive Guide (CIG) in 2005, and has attended numerous other workshops and programs adding to her experience. Kyle Daniel

Kyle Daniel is the Nursery and Landscape Specialist in the Department of Horticulture and Landscape Architecture at Purdue University. Kyle has a 100% extension appointment, but co-teaches Ornamental Plant Production each year and has several research trials which include native ornamental plant selections and developing proper root morphology in nursery containers. He is the Education Director for the Indiana Nursery and Landscape Association and is the co-director for education at the Indiana Green Expo.

Steven Hayes, Jr.

Stephen is the fourth generation of a family focused on promoting resource conservation and environmental stewardship. He oversees management of 466 acres, 80% are designated Classified Forest. Stephen works to implement the recommendations of their Forest Stewardship Plan and enjoys active coordination with the local environmental resource agencies. He has been involved with resource conservation projects such as; the construction of a grassy waterway and invasive brush removal, coordinating with the NRCS, the District Forester and a Consulting Forester. Stephen has completed the Purdue Extension Workshop on Woodland Management and has received a training certificate in Emerald Ash Borer pest management. Stephen currently serves on the Purdue Extension Board and enjoys volunteering with the Richmond Rose Garden and Cardinal Greenway.

Cliff Sadof

Cliff Sadof is a Professor of Entomology at Purdue University and has been the State Extension Specialist for insects of ornamental plants since 1990. Cliff teaches an undergraduate class on insects of ornamental plants and conducts research on managing landscape pests with fewer pesticides. Most recently Sadof, teamed up with Janna Beckerman to develop the Purdue Plant Doctor series of Apps to help homeowners and professionals diagnose insect, disease and abiotic disorders on over ornamentals. Cliff has also leads a substantial outreach effort in response to the invasion of the emerald ash borer. In the process he has developed a number of tools including the emerald ash borer cost calculator to help municipalities compare the costs and benefits of management responses over a 25 year period.

Rachel Hughes, MA, CFRM, has over twenty-four years of experience as a fund-raising professional. She currently serves as the Development Officer for the Wayne County Foundation where she works to grow the Foundation through sustained relationship development and to empower nonprofits through endowment building and professional development opportunities.
